Unity - uniformity?

Last week was the annual Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, something for which Jesus prayed earnestly for His followers (see John 17). Sadly, it would seem all too often that Jesus' prayer has not been answered. In the history of our own country, and in several places in the world, fights between Christians, with words, or even weapons, are common. Such conflict frequently occurs when the church is being 'successful', with good and increasing numbers, and God's 'severe mercy' may allow persecution and suffering to bring Christians back together again.

Yet, as with so much else, that does not mean we should give up praying and doing what we can to make Jesus' prayer come true. It is good that Churches Together in Weobley are an example of this. I personally have experienced a great sense of unity amongst leaders of many different denominations in Hereford city, not just in holding meetings, but in showing and declaring the love of God revealed in Jesus in such things as Vennture, the Good Friday march of witness, a stand at the River Carnival and online prayer.

Unity is not the same as uniformity; we don't have to worship or act the same way. Several times recently my Bible reading has thrown up the powerful image of the church as a body, many different parts but all needing each other to function properly. How easy it is to things that our way of doing things or interpretation of Scripture is the only, or the best, one! We need to be humble and remember that God often uses methods and people that some think strange, or even wrong, to work out His purposes. Let's be open to Him and to all other Christians we know.

Searching for a pattern of Sunday Services



Last Sunday morning, Rev'd Guy Wilkinson filmed, and streamed live to Facebook the Sunday Worship from Weobley Church. This was part of a pattern of services during the day and, by virtue of being filmed and posted to Facebook and then later to our Group Web and YouTube sites, it was possible to watch and join with the service at the time, or of course at any convenient time we might choose. We have had 125 views of the service to date.

With the current health climate and lockdown protocols so challenging to communal, public worship, the clergy team and representatives from the parishes have been thinking long and carefully about how best to provide a service schedule that can reach the greatest number of people who wish to worship each Sunday, whilst also offering a service for those that wish to receive the sacrament materially.

This Sunday, as last, there will be a Eucharistic (CW) service at Weobley St Peter & St Paul at 10.30am which will also be live-streamed to Facebook. Also at 10.30am there will be a Holy Communion (BCP) online on Zoom and this will offer those who want to engage with the service and those attending by having a few words at the end of the service, a slightly different experience. And then, in the afternoon at 5.30pm, there will be Evening Prayer (BCP), also online on Zoom.

Importantly, this may well be the pattern of Sunday Services going ahead through February and quite possibly for as long the lockdown protocols remain in place. So, we would heartily welcome your thoughts on this pattern of Services. *People & Steeple* reaches almost 200 congregants and we want to hear from you. Specifically on these questions: (1) have you been able to attend any of our online services; (2) if not, but if you could attend just one of the morning services, which would you choose and why, and (3) do you feel these differing types of services are meeting your needs as members of our wider congregation while we cannot easily or safely meet in church.
