¶ **Ps. 68. Exurgat Deus VIII.1**

**L**ET God arise, and let his enemies be  
scattered : let them also that hate him flee  
before him.

**Like as the smoke vanisheth, so  
shalt thou drive them away : and  
like as wax melteth at the fire, so  
let the ungodly perish at the  
présence of God.**

But let the righteous be glad and rejoice  
before Gód : let them also be merry and  
joyful.

**O sing unto God, and sing  
praises unto his Name\*; magnify  
him that rideth upon the  
heavens, as it were upon an  
hóirse : praise him in his Name  
JAH, and rejóice before him.**

He is a father of the fatherless,\* and  
defendeth the cause of the wídows : even  
God in his holy hábitation.

**He is the God that maketh men  
to be of one mind in an house,  
and bringeth the prisoners out of  
captivity : but letteth the run-

**The earth shook, and the  
heavens dropped at the presence  
of Gód : even as Sinai also was  
moved at the presence of God,  
who is the Gód of Israel.**

Thou, O God, sentest a gracious rain upon  
thine inhéritance : and refreshedst it when it  
was weary.

**Thy congregation shall dwell  
therein : for thou, O God, hast of  
thy goodness prepared for the  
poor.**

Here beginneth the 4th verse of the 50th chapter of the prophecy of Isaiah.

**T**HE Lord GOD hath given me the tongue of the learned, that I should know how to speak a word in season to him that is weary: he wakeneth morning by morning, he wakeneth mine ear to hear as the learned. The Lord GOD hath opened mine ear, and I was not rebellious, neither turned away back. I gave my back to the smiters, and my cheeks to them that plucked off the hair: I hid not my face from shame and spitting.

For the Lord GOD will help me; therefore shall I not be confounded: therefore have I set my face like a flint, and I know that I shall not be ashamed. He is near that justifieth me; who will contend with me? let us stand together: who is mine adversary? let him come near to me. Behold, the Lord GOD will help me; who is he that shall condemn me? lo, they all shall wax old as a garment; the moth shall eat them up.

Who is among you that feareth the LORD, that obeyeth the voice of his servant, that walketh in darkness, and hath no light? let him trust in the name of the LORD, and stay upon his God.

Here beginneth the 20th verse of the 12th  
chapter of the gospel according to S. John.

**A**ND there were certain Greeks among  
them that came up to worship at the  
feast: The same came therefore to Philip,  
which was of Bethsaida of Galilee, and

desired him, saying, 'Sir, we would see Jesus.' Philip cometh and telleth Andrew: and again Andrew and Philip tell Jesus. And Jesus answered them, saying, 'The hour is come, that the Son of man should be glorified. Verily, verily, I say unto you, Except a corn of wheat fall into the ground and die, it abideth alone: but if it die, it bringeth forth much fruit. He that loveth his life shall lose it; and he that hateth his life in this world shall keep it unto life eternal. If any man serve me, let him follow me; and where I am, there shall also my servant be: if any man serve me, him will my Father honour.

'Now is my soul troubled; and what shall I say? "Father, save me from this hour:" but for this cause came I unto this hour. "Father, glorify thy name."' Then came there a voice from heaven, saying, 'I have both glorified it, and will glorify it again.' The people therefore, that stood by, and heard it, said that it thundered: others said, 'An angel spake to him.' Jesus answered and said, 'This voice came not because of me, but for your sakes. Now is the judgment of this world: now shall the prince of this world be cast out. And I, if I be lifted up from the earth, will draw all men unto me.'

This he said, signifying what death he should die. The people answered him, 'We have heard out of the law that Christ abideth for ever: and how sayest thou, 'The Son of man must be lifted up?' Who is this Son of man?' Then Jesus said unto them, 'Yet a little while is the light with you. Walk while ye have the light, lest darkness come upon you: for he that walketh in darkness knoweth not whither he goeth. While ye have light, believe in the light, that ye may be the children of light.' These things spake Jesus, and departed, and did hide himself from them.

But though he had done so many miracles before them, yet they believed not on him: That the saying of Esaias the prophet might

be fulfilled, which he spake, *Lord, who hath believed our report? and to whom hath the arm of the Lord been revealed?* Therefore they could not believe, because that Esaias said again, *He hath blinded their eyes, and hardened their heart; that they should not see with their eyes, nor understand with their heart, and be converted, and I should heal them.* These things said Esaias, when he saw his glory, and spake of him.

Nevertheless among the chief rulers also many believed on him; but because of the Pharisees they did not confess him, lest they should be put out of the synagogue: For they loved the praise of men more than the praise of God.

Jesus cried and said, 'He that believeth on me, believeth not on me, but on him that sent me. And he that seeth me seeth him that sent me. I am come a light into the world, that whosoever believeth on me should not abide in darkness. And if any man hear my words, and believe not, I judge him not: for I came not to judge the world, but to save the world. He that rejecteth me, and receiveth not my words, hath one that judgeth him: the word that I have spoken, the same shall judge him in the last day. For I have not spoken of myself; but the Father which sent me, he gave me a commandment, what I should say, and what I should speak. And I know that his commandment is life everlasting: whatsoever I speak therefore, even as the Father said unto me, so I speak.'

**Jn 12:20-50 AV**
